

Deadline

The deadline for entries is July 30, 2010. Early entries, however, have greater opportunity for pre-event publicity in the media. You are encouraged to begin the jury process early. Accepted entries will be notified within two weeks of receipt. Exhibit space fees are due to DWNA within 10 days of acceptance.

Arrangements

Set up begins Saturday, September 18, 10 a.m. All exhibits must be set up and vehicles parked for the day by 11:30 a.m.

Artist tear down begins no earlier than 7 p.m.

Numa Arts and Cultural Event will be held regardless of weather.

Each exhibitor will be responsible for the display, custody and sale of his / her own work, and each exhibitor must provide his or her own tent, display boards, tables, easels and other display items.

Neither the DWNA or the City of Westfield, nor any representative, member or volunteer of those organizations will be responsible for any losses or damage to any work exhibited or property brought to the Numa Arts and Cultural Event. The receipt of your entry form and check will constitute your agreement to exhibit subject to these conditions.

For out-of-town or out-of-state guests: Accommodations have been arranged at the Comfort Inn in Westfield.
